



## **E-LIFE KID AND E-LIFE KID MISSIONARY REQUIREMENTS**

### **E-LIFE Kid Requirements**

1. Have a personal relationship with Christ Jesus.
2. Regularly attend church.
3. Fulfill the Five Commitments of an E-LIFE Kid:
  - Seek the Spirit's help in helping others.
  - Show kindness and friendship.
  - Share "The Story" of Jesus.
  - Invite others to church and to know Christ.
  - Invest in the lives of others.
4. Memorize the E-LIFE plan of salvation and cite it to your children's pastor/leader or parent.
5. Successfully demonstrate how to use the E-LIFE Witnessing Tool while citing the E-LIFE plan of salvation.

### **E-LIFE Kid Missionary Requirements**

1. Have a personal relationship with Christ Jesus.
2. Fulfill the requirements of being an E-LIFE Kid, and daily fulfill your Five Commitments of an E-LIFE Kid.
3. Fulfill the Five Commitments of an E-LIFE Kid:
  - Seek the Spirit's help in helping others.
  - Show kindness and friendship.
  - Share "The Story" of Jesus.
  - Invite others to church and to know Christ.
  - Invest in the lives of others.
4. Make a public proclamation in church that you want to become an E-LIFE Kid Missionary. If possible, be commissioned as an E-LIFE Missionary during an adult service at church.
5. Regularly attend church.
6. Regularly read your Bible.
7. Establish a regular time of talking with (praying to) God.

8. Ask the Holy Spirit daily to provide new chances in which you can share your faith with others.
9. Share your faith in some manner at school or in your neighborhood at least one a week. If possible, obtain from your E-LIFE coach the E-LIFE Witnessing Tool, which is available from Gospel Publishing House, and use the Witnessing Tool to share the E-LIFE plan of salvation with others.
10. Meet monthly with your E-LIFE coach.
11. Ask your E-LIFE coach for printouts of the E-LIFE Kids Journal. Develop a personal plan with your E-LIFE coach of how you can be a missionary to your school. Write down your objectives on your E-LIFE Kids Journal. Review those objectives with your E-LIFE coach and record those new objectives in your journal.
12. Try to make a new friend at least once a month.
13. Invite at least one student to church every month.
14. Try to organize an E-LIFE club in your school, church, or community. This may simply include finding a group of students who will pray with you at least once a week before or after school. It could include an organized and ongoing E-LIFE club meeting at school or at another location. It could also include simply meeting on a regular basis with other Christian friends who want to discuss the Bible and/or do E-LIFE activities—such as the E-xtreme Fun games and High Octane devotionals.
